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Independent Student Verification Worksheet 2023-2024

Your 2023–2024 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) was selected for review in a process called verification. The law says that before awarding Federal Student Aid, we may ask you to confirm the information you reported on your FAFSA. To verify that you provided correct information, we will compare your FAFSA with the information on this worksheet and with any other required documents. If there are differences, your FAFSA information may need to be corrected. You must complete and sign this worksheet, attach any required documents, and return them to the School of Law Office of Financial Aid. You may be asked to provide additional information. If you have questions about verification, contact our office so that your financial aid will not be delayed.

The best way to verify income is by using the IRS Data Retrieval Tool that is part of FAFSA on the Web. If you did not use the tool with your initial application, you may go to <u>www.fafsa.gov</u>, retrieve your FAFSA record, select "Make FAFSA Corrections," and navigate to the Financial Information section. From there, follow the instructions to determine if you are eligible to use the IRS Data Retrieval Tool to transfer 2021 IRS income tax information into the FAFSA. Keep in mind there is a waiting period from when you submit your federal tax return to when the data is processed and available for transfer to the FAFSA via the IRS Data Retrieval process. Electronic tax filers should allow up to two weeks and paper tax filers should allow up to eight weeks.
